Grinding Wheels Need Respect

Once again, another grinding wheel has been used incorrectly. When there is a sign on the grinding wheel stating that Aluminium & Brass should not be ground on that machine please take notice! If it is not steel then use the lisher bench machine to the right of the grinding wheels. The one with the abrasive belt.

In other instances, the grinding wheels have been deeply grooved by members doing heavy work all on the one spot of the wheel. When grinding always move backwards and forwards across the whole surface of the wheel. This not only keeps the wheel nice and flat but also stops the item that is being ground from burning by moving to cooler parts of the stone all the time.

Different grinders have been set up for different tasks, if you are unsure of a grinder operation please seek help. There is a separate wheel for carbide steels only.

Some of your fellow shedders have to spend considerable time on repairs and redressing the grinding wheels rather than working on their own projects. This is a good time to thank them for their efforts and to remind others to have respect for their work by taking care in the use of the tools and machinery in our shed.
