The meal was one of the highlights of the Men's Heath Week presentation at the Shed.


A big thank you to Max Elliot and Idris, who provide the leadership, and the whole Cooking group for their dedication. They also seem to have a lot of fun as well!

New Wood Turning Lathe



Introducing our new Nova - Orion wood turning lathe that was commissioned early in May 2024.

The lathe has electronic variable speed control, from 100 RPM up to 5000 RPM.

It has 8 preset memory speeds that have been set from 100 RPM at intervals up to 3600 RPM, which is the maximum speed of our other 2 belt driven lathes.

The Orion will run forward and reverse.

This is a welcome addition to our wood turning area

Shed Welding Course

The Welding course was an introduction to welding (stick welding), held over four Fridays with four hours of instruction per day. There were six participants, working in pairs using three different welding machines.

The participants were Martin Buddery, Richard Lilischkis, Ted Reid, Adrian Thompson, Matt Caine and Rod Heydon.

The Instructor, Richard Butcher, has qualifications as a welder, boilermaker, blacksmith, metallurgist and senior TAFE lecturer. He spent much of his career at the Eveleigh Railway Sheds. He is a rail enthusiast (especially steam) and an active conservationist of railway heritage. He has also authored books on railways.

As a spritely 87 year old, his welding skills are still in demand, in particular on certain steam locomotives and at the Galston Model Railway.

Mark Restuccia acted in a support role for the course and spent many hours preparing metal that was used during the course.

All the Shedders attending learnt a lot on the course and were kept entertained by the instructors anecdotes. They are probably not yet first pick to weld the AUKUS nuclear submarines, but would have a good shot at repairing their box trailers.


