A costing and budget was drawn up requiring some \$400 in funds for the materials to build three benches.

Another Tasty Session at The Cooking Group



Move over Baker's Delight! The highlight at the last Shed Cooking meet had to be the proud production of magnificent Hot Cross Buns. The boys were instructed on the necessity of sufficient kneading for the dough's preparation.

Our buns were such a satisfying result, and leave us with a critical appraisal of the storebought offerings. The Shed Cookbook features our Hot Cross Bun recipe, but you'll have to bail up one of our cooks to know the secret to success.

The 3 course March lunch menu included an entree of a crisp, chilled wedge of Iceberg Lettuce with Green Goddess Dressing, garnished with hard boiled egg and fine strips of fried bacon. Individual dishes of Fish Pie with Green Beans followed for the main and a dessert of macerated green Grapes in Brandy, topped with dollops of sour cream, sprinkled with brown sugar and flashed under the grill to caramelise.

Secrets of the Harbour Cruise
